




# CREATIVE CHOICE SPELLING ACTIVITIES

In addition to the assigned spelling activities, students can choose among 16 fun and creative ways to practice their spelling words. Most assignments can be completed in their homework journal. However, not all assignments can be. For those activities, a parent signature is required to ensure me that you saw your child doing the activity. Most of those activities are hands-on. Those activities that require a parent note have a symbol that looks like this:



1. ABC Order-  Write your words in alphabetical order.	2. Rainbow Words-  Write your words in three different colors.	3. Backwards Words-  Write your words forwards and then backwards.	4. Silly Sentences-  Use all your words in 10 silly sentences.
5. Picture Words-  Draw a picture and write your words in the picture.	6. Words without Vowels-  Write your words replacing all vowels with a line. Then write the same words again, only this time replace the consonants.	7. Story Words-  Write a story using all of your spelling words.	8. Scrambled Words-  Write your words, then write them again with the letters mixed up.
9. Ransom Words-  Write your words by cutting out letters in a newspaper or magazine and glue them in your notebook.	10. Pyramid Word-  Write your words adding or subtracting one letter at a time. The result will be a pyramid shape of words.	11. Words in a Word-  Write your word and then write at least 2 words made from that word.	12. Delicious Words-  Write your words in whipped cream, peanut butter, or anything else you can eat! Bring in a note from a parent. 
13. Clean Words-  Write your words in shaving cream on a counter. 	14. Etch-a-word  Use an Etch-a-Sketch to write your words. 	15. Telephone Words-  Translate your words into numbers from a telephone keypad. Write the code in your spelling journal.	16. Silly String-  With a long length of string, "write" words in cursive, using the string to shape the letters.
